# ANNEX TO THE VISITOR REGULATIONS FOR GHENT UNIVERSITY MUSEUM AND BOTANICAL GARDEN



This annex to the visitor regulations for Ghent University Museum and Botanical Garden is a temporary addendum to the normal regulations. Its temporary nature is linked to the duration of the measures taken by the government regarding COVID-19 which impact visits to the museum.

The rules of these temporary visitor regulations take precedence over the rules in the normal visitor regulations.

## Article 1

The opening hours may differ compared to the regular opening hours. The temporary opening hours are listed on the website of the GUM/Botanical Garden ([www.gum.gent](http://www.gum.gent)) and at the entrance of the GUM/Botanical Garden.

## Article 2

There is a limit to the number of visitors that may be present in the museum rooms and Botanical Garden zones at any one time. In order to visit the

GUM/Botanical Garden, visitors must reserve a time slot online, in advance, on the museum's website ([www.gum.gent](http://www.gum.gent)).

### Article 3

The GUM/Botanical Garden can temporarily adjust the provisions (e.g. capacity, starting time, number of groups) relating to any group/school activities.

### Article 4

The museum is in strict compliance with all regulations imposed or recommended by the central and local governments to avoid possible infections with coronavirus. All possible preventive measures have been taken to guarantee the safety of visitors and employees.

In order to guarantee visitors' and employees' safety, specific guidelines will be provided to anyone visiting the museum. These guidelines may evolve based on the measures taken by the government regarding COVID-19. The guidelines can be found on the museum's website and will be visibly displayed at the entrance of the GUM/Botanical Garden and possibly at other locations throughout the GUM/Botanical Garden.

When purchasing a ticket, visitors automatically agree to comply with these guidelines during their visit to the museum. In case of non-compliance, visitors may be refused access to the GUM/Botanical Garden or may be asked to leave the GUM/Botanical Garden.

The museum and its staff shall in no case be held liable should visitors be infected with the virus, despite all precautions and measures taken..

### Article 5

These temporary regulations enter into force on 6 July 2020 and shall remain in force for the entire duration of the measures taken by the government regarding COVID-19 which impact visits to the museum.
